Examples of High-Scoring Planning Commentary Two types of writing required for assembling a portfolio include descriptive and analytical. Descriptive writing is logical, well-ordered, with sufficient detail so the assessor comprehends the lesson plans, the students, and explanations supporting decisions about instruction.

Another perspective is that edTPA assesses whether new teachers are able to align their activities with specific practices. Although student teachers may choose various approaches for planning, instructing, and assessing as the building blocks of their edTPA portfolios, some strategies align more readily with the edTPA model.
